Mission Statement

In partnership with the family and the church, the mission of Tree of Life Christian Schools is to glorify God by educating students in His truth and by discipling them in Christ.

Christian Philosophy of Education

A Christian Philosophy of Education calls for an educational process that puts the Bible at the center and asks the student to evaluate all he/she studies through the lens of God’s Word. Because God is Truth, He brings a unity of truth to all of his creation. No subject can be taught in its totality if the Creator is ignored or denied.

“ Jesus said to him, ‘I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.’” (John 14:6)

“ ... all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together.” (Colossians 1:15–17; 16b–17)

“All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.” (II Timothy 3:14–17; 16–17)

Christian education elicits learning that is integrated with the eternal rather than segmented and temporal. Knowledge becomes purified by the recognition of God’s place in it; emerging from such knowledge comes wisdom.

“For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding...” (Proverbs 2:6)

“Wisdom is a tree of life to those who take hold of her.” (Proverbs 3:18)

In addition to an integrated approach to knowledge, a Christian philosophy of education calls for the whole child to be educated for life – spiritually, mentally, socially, and physically. Jesus admonished His disciples, “Permit the little children to come to me for of such is the Kingdom of heaven.” (Matt. 18:3) In Christian schools, students can come to know Jesus on a daily basis, as they are discipled as complete creations in Him. Spiritual mentoring and modeling, godly self-discipline and Christ-like expectations of how to treat one another can be woven into the fabric of each child’s life.

“...You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” (Matthew 22:37–40; 37,39)

“For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.” (Ephesians 2:10)

The Word of God is clear in making parents responsible for the education of their children. ***“You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.” (Deut. 6:4–9;7)*** In entrusting the church and school to help them in this task, parents rightly ask, “What is to be the end result of learning?” John Milton, in 1644 wisely answered, “The end, then, of learning is to repair the ruins of our first parents by regaining to know God aright, and out of that knowledge to love Him, imitate Him, to be like Him.”

We are saved by grace of God, received as the gift of God through personal faith in Jesus Christ (*Ephesians 2:8-9*), we come repenting of our sins, confessing Him as Lord before men, and receiving baptism into Him (*Matthew 16:16; Acts 2:38; Acts 8; Acts 16; Romans 10:10*).

The Church is the body and bride of Christ (*Ephesians 1:22-23; 5:25-32*), composed of all believers (*I Corinthians 12:12-13*), growing together in fellowship and ministry (*Ephesians 4:11-16, Acts 2*).

A lifestyle that strives for righteousness, good works and separation unto God from the evil ways of the world (*Romans 12:1-2*), manifested by speaking the truth (*James 5:12*), maintaining the sanctity of the home (*Ephesians 5:22, 6:4*), settling differences between Christians in accordance with the Word of God (*I Corinthians 6:1-8*), exhibiting the fruit of the spirit (*Galatians 5:22-23*), and maintaining a life of prayer (*Ephesians 6:18; Philippians 4:6*).

The conscious existence of the dead (*Philippians 1:21-23; Luke 16:19-31*), the resurrection of the body (*John 5:28-29*), the judgement and reward of believers (*Romans 14:10-12; II Corinthians 5:10*), the judgement and condemnation of unbelievers (*Revelation 20:11-15*), the eternal life of the saved (*John 3:16*), and the eternal punishment of the lost (*Matthew 25:46; Revelation 20:15*).

But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect... (I Peter 3:15)

Engage the culture for Christ, as His ambassadors in a diverse world.

The middle school program is designed to guide our students through the transition between their elementary and high school years.

6th Grade

Sixth grade classes are still predominately self-contained with a team-teaching approach by primary teachers. This curriculum includes an introduction to other middle school courses in band, art, music, library skills, physical education, and computer. Student academic intervention services are available, including tutoring.

7th Grade – 8th Grade

With seventh and eighth grade students changing classes over a nine-period day, teachers approach each class understanding the fundamental differences between middle school and elementary or high school students. Instruction in skills of organization, note taking, and research are taught early and implemented throughout the middle school years. Student academic intervention services are available, including tutoring. A focus on developing godly character is an integral part of the middle school program.

Sibling tuition reductions (applied at grade level): 2nd child 10%, 3rd child 20%, 4th child 30%, all others 40%.

Tuition/Facility Fee Payment Methods

Option One: Single Payment Plan – Payment due in full to Tree of Life by Aug. 10, 2010 or within 10 days of enrollment. If tuition is paid in full, the total facility fee must be paid at the same time.

Option Two: 10 Month Plan – Payments made through FACTS. First payment due August, 2010 through May, 2011.

Option Three: 12 Month Plan – Payments made through FACTS. First payment due August, 2010 through July, 2011.

Option Four: Variable Plan – For new students enrolling after July 1, 2010.

Please Note: All monthly payment plans will include tuition and facility fees. If the FACTS paperwork is not received at the school by July 1, Tree of Life will determine the monthly payment schedule. After June 15th, a withdrawal fee of 1/6 of the annual tuition for the student's grade level will be assessed. This fee is also assessed to students who withdraw during the school year.



Admission / Related Fees

PRESCHOOL

Application Fee: \$50 (One time, non-refundable fee due with application.)

Tuition Management Fee: \$38 annually per school family deducted by FACTS Tuition Management from your bank account, for families paying tuition on a monthly basis. This fee is non-refundable.

Payment Plan Change Fee: \$20 processing fee charged for any change made in Payment Plan Option after July 1st. Preschool only families do not pay any of the additional fees listed below.

GRADES K – 12

Application Fee: \$50 per student for all grade levels. (This is a one time, non-refundable fee due with application.)

Enrollment Fee: \$150 per student. (This is a non-refundable fee due at the time of the parent interview.)

Facility Fee: \$300 annually, per school family for grades 1-12. \$150 annually for kindergarten only families.

Tuition Management Fee: \$38 annually per school family deducted by FACTS Tuition Management from your bank account for families paying on a monthly basis. This fee is non-refundable.

Withdrawal Fee: After June 15, a withdrawal fee of 1/6 of the annual tuition for the student's grade level will be assessed. This fee is also assessed to students who withdraw during the school year.

Re-admission Fee: \$150 non-refundable fee per student who has been previously enrolled at Tree of Life. (This one-time fee is due with the re-admission form. It is in lieu of the application and enrollment fees.)

Payment Plan Change Fee: \$20 processing fee charged for any change made in Payment Plan Option after July 1st.

Admission Information

ADMISSION PROCESS

The admission policy for Tree of Life Christian Schools is mission driven. The school's mission involves a loving, cooperative, and committed partnership among the home, the church, and the school so that students may be educated in the Truth and disciplined in Christ.

1. Parents submit the application and application fee to Tree of Life Christian Schools.
2. Upon receipt of the application, a second packet of forms is sent to the family.
3. After the designated re-enrollment period for current school families, new applications (including the initial application and second packet of forms) are reviewed by the building principal.
4. The building principal will schedule student testing (K-12) and parent interviews (based upon classroom space that is or may become available) for students whose application materials demonstrate that they may be well served by the school and that they and their parents may be willing to be a part of fulfilling the school's mission.
5. Approval of admission to Tree of Life Christian Schools will be based on:
 - a. Student testing results
 - b. Previous years' grade cards/progress reports reflecting successful completion of the previous grade
 - c. Reference from previous school(s)
 - d. Church Reference form
 - e. Acceptable completion of Parent Questionnaire and authorization forms
 - f. For middle school and high school students, acceptable completion of Student Questionnaire
 - g. For high school students, completion of Standards of Conduct form
 - h. Parent interviews - All grades
 - i. Student interview - middle and high school students
 - j. Space available
6. After student testing and the parent interview, enrollment decisions are made by the administration.
7. The enrollment fee is due at the time of the parent interview. Payment of this fee secures the student's place in his/her grade.

International Student Program

Out of a desire to further reflect God’s Kingdom in our school, Tree of Life welcomes international students. To best serve international students, the following guidelines have been established:

1. International preschool through second grade students may not attend Tree of Life unless they are living with their parents. Exceptions are at the principal’s discretion only.
2. International students will only live with the relative/guardian/host family/agency the school agreed to when they were accepted. Evidence of guardianship or agency placement must be submitted for all international students not living with their biological parents.
3. All international students must comply with the admissions standards of Tree of Life.
4. At the principal’s discretion, class size and composition may affect the number of international students admitted in any grade level.
5. Re-enrollment for international students may be evaluated each year.
6. If at the discretion of the principal, an international student needs language support, ESL classes will be provided. To cover the cost of this service, the family will be expected to pay the following international tuition rate instead of the standard tuition.
